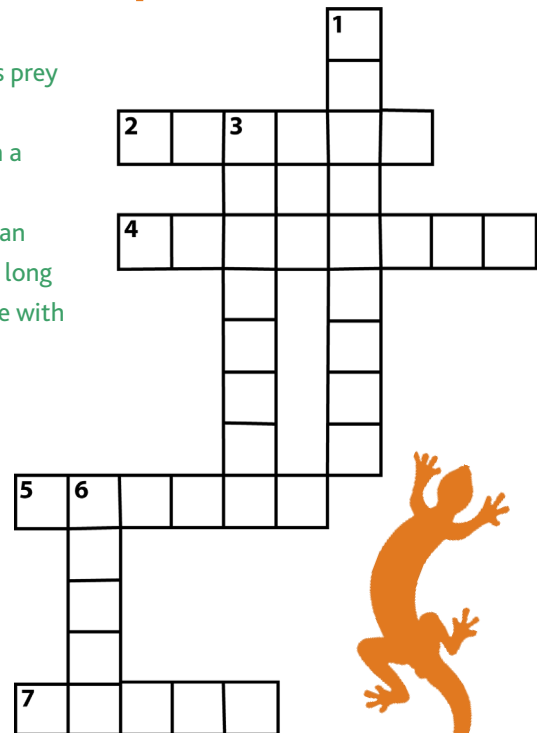
### ACROSS

A young visitor to the Wildlife Park once asked where he could find the "spectacular" owls. He meant "spectacled" owls, but with their amazing good looks they really are spectacular! The female lays one or two eggs each year - the chicks look like fluffy white balls!

#### Habitat

Tropical rainforests across South America

#### Food in the Wild

Small animals such as mice, frogs and birds. Sometimes insects too

#### Superpower

They can swivel their head nearly round to the back (but not ALL the way round!)
