Rainforest Exploration

Habitats and Adaptation



This session aims to develop a solid understanding of why and how different animals have adapted to different habitats. Using various props and live animals, we explore the world's amazing biodiversity.

Predators





Eat or be eaten! We explore a variety of replica skulls and other biofacts to highlight the differences between predator and their prey. We take a look at a simple food chain to develop understanding of who eats who.

Super Senses





Based mostly, weather permitting, in the Secret Garden (behind the classroom), this workshop highlights some of the incredible senses found in the animal kingdom, through a fun exploration of the pupils' own senses.

Fur, Feathers and Scales



Sorting animals into groups fascinates all age groups and helps develop an understanding of the natural world. Choose this topic if your KS1 group are looking at "Paws, Claws and Whiskers". KS2 groups will explore the topic in greater depth.

Eco Warriers!



Most of today's youngsters care passionately about saving the planet. Using dressing-up props and biofacts, this session will develop a clear understanding of the challenges that face animals in the wild in a fun and memorable workshop.

Animal Adventure







The perfect choice for a general visit, and ideal for treat/ enrichment/team-building trips. We will adapt this topic to suit your group, and try to include anything about animals that you ask us to highlight.

Charles Darwin and Evolution Yr 5/6



Charles Darwin revolutionised our understanding of the animal kingdom with his theory of evolution. This workshop explores Darwin's discoveries and how natural selection adapts animals to live in a variety of habitats.

Self-Guided Visit





School groups can opt to do their own thing around the Park and not book an education session. Feel free to get in touch if you would like to be sent an activity trail, or arrange a meet up at an animal enclosure.

Outdoor Learning Tour







Would you prefer your education session to take place outdoors, next to animal enclosures?

We will pick up the portable PA and take your pupils on a learning tour, with interactive talks close to the animals. You can pick up to 5 of your favourite animals, or let us select the best ones for your topic. For very young children we will incorporate activities such as animal sounds and movement. If the weather is just too bad to be outside, we will move into the classroom and adapt accordingly!

Learning around the world

Awesome Australia





With the help of a slide show, interesting biofacts and replicas, not to mention our Australian inhabitants, this session teaches the children about Australia's unique and fascinating wildlife.

African Safari

Cold at the Poles

The Curragh Nature Trail

The Curragh Nature Trail could form the main focus of your trip - perfect if you are studying local habitat, or Manx Biosphere (ask about an accompanying classroom session). Or if time allows, you could enjoy exploring when you have completed your main topic.

Located on the southern side of the Wildlife Park, the Curragh Nature Trail leads you through an internationally recognised unique natural wetland habitat.
